Performance of additional cleanup work in the Oceanview Cemetery has been completed with the removal of several dead trees.

Representatives from the State Historic Preservation Office visited the site and were pleased with the cleanup efforts. Multiple headstones that had previously been covered were uncovered. They are planning to host in conjunction with the Town a workshop in the spring of 2023.



Town Submits 4 Funding Requests

- •A \$3.3 million funding request was submitted to the North Carolina the Clean Water State Revolving Fund (NC SRF) to cover the estimated construction funding gap for the wastewater rehabilitation portion of the USDA-funded utilities project. Funding from this source is provided in the form of low-interest loans (half of market interest rates) and via limited amount of principal forgiveness loans.
- •A \$5 million funding request was submitted to the NC SRF to cover the estimated construction funding gap for the water distribution system replacements and upgrades portion of the USDA-funded utilities project.
- •A 4.4 million grant funding request was submitted to the Local Assistance for Stormwater Infrastructure Investments Program (LASII program) to fund the installation of four stormwater treatment systems as an addition to the USDA-funded utilities project.
- •A \$400,000 grant request was submitted to the LASII program to fund an Inventory, Assessment and Planning Study that targets the Meeting Street flooding issue with a goal of determining alternatives if any, for mitigating the frequency and degree of flooding.

Unit Flow Reduction Study Project

The unit flow reduction study for multifamily residential units was submitted Oct. 3 to the NC Department of Environmental Quality (NCDEQ). The study recommended lowering the standard regulatory unit flow design value of 120 gallons per day per bedroom (gpd/bedroom) to 60 bedroom. A response from NCDEQ is being awaited.

Water Repairs

- · Water well no. 3 is expected to be returned to service by October 6th pursuant to its repair.
- Utilities staff repaired water line leaks at the corner of Belle Air Street and Ann Street on Sept. 28 and Oct. 3 caused by a landscaping contractor. The landscape contractor is being billed for Town incurred expenses for the second repair.

Stormwater Improvements

Public Works Staff completed a stormwater improvements project that serves Charles Street .

Town Facilities

Staff completed the placement of concrete curbing along the north side of Town Hall and placed landscaping brick chips in the yard area between the curbing and the existing sidewalk. Staff also completed the seasonal decommissioning of the splash pad for the season.

Pedestrian Crossing Signage

Staff installed pedestrian crossing signs along Mulberry Street at the Boys and Girls Club.

Trees & Landscaping

- · Single stem Biloxi Crape Myrtle trees were placed within the tree wells along the 500 block of Front Street.
- Dead trees at heights up to 75 feet and within the right-of-way of Fairview Drive were removed.

Upcoming Duke Energy Project at John Newton Park

Duke Energy will be installing new conduit to service the lights on the boardwalk in the area of John Newton Park. During the process, which is anticipated to begin in Friday, Oct. 14, concrete panels will be removed from the park area. These areas will be replaced when the work is complete. The West Parking Lot will be closed Monday, Oct. 17-Wednesday, Oct. 19.

Police Department Welcomes New Hires

The Police Department welcomes Officer Chrisman and Officer Bullock as well as a current Basic Law Enforcement Training student has signed a conditional offer to start in December.

Cedar Street Paving

NCDOT is expected to install stormwater bioswales on Cedar Street this winter. The Town's application for funding for pervious concrete for the parking spaces is pending with an expected announcement in October. Paving will commence in the spring of 2023.
