What are King Tides?

- King tides are the highest high and lowest low tide events of the year.
- They are regular and predictable events that occur when the Sun, Earth and Moon are in alignment and the Moon is at its closest point to the Earth.
- These conditions cause extreme highs and lows during the daily tidal cycle.







To help identify the how, when, where and tips about flooding, the Town of Beaufort recommends that you visit the Carteret County web site at

www.carteretcountygov.org and select Carteret County Flood Tips Brochure. Residents of Beaufort should receive approximately a 15% discount on Flood Insurance policies for primary residents due to the Town participating in the National Flood Program.
