Infrastructure Repairs for Cleaner Waterways

For several years, professors and students from the University of North Carolina Institute of Marine Sciences (UNC-IMS) have been measuring toxins entering the waterways in and around Beaufort. Our infrastructure has collapsed in some areas and we believe collapsed sewer pipes have leached into our storm water systems and this pollution is degrading the quality of our waterways. As I have mentioned previously, a massive effort is underway to repair our infrastructure and these extensive repairs will contribute to a cleaner coastal ecosystem. An example of this work is underway as we dig up and repair the underground utilities (storm



water, drinking water, and sewer) systems on the 100 block of Orange Street. UNC-IMS water quality experts have seen a strong signal of toxins at the storm water outfall at the end of Orange Street, and these repairs on the 100 block should mitigate some of the sources of this pollution. This project also includes large sections of pervious surface on the street surface as another way to reduce storm water effects.

Town Engineer Greg Meshaw provides an update on major projects during Beaufort

Rachel and UNC-IMS colleagues have conducted extensive research in Beaufort waterways and this research has highlighted our need for significant infrastructure repairs, and increased measures to clean up our waterways. In addition, this work has been extraordinarily helpful as we apply for USDA loans and grants to support these infrastructure repairs. During the COVID-19 pandemic, Rachel and her team have also been actively involved in ground-breaking research to detect COVID-19 by routine sampling at the waste water treatment plants in Carteret

County and across the state. In some cases, these techniques can detect COVID-19 outbreaks well in advance of normal testing measures. We have talented and caring citizens in our town, and Dr. Rachel Noble certainly represents the very best of Beaufort.

Save Those Shells

Rather than tossing oyster shells in the trash, which is illegal, there are several shell recycling drop-off sites across the coast. The North Carolina Coastal Federation Recycling for Reefs Program offers recycling sites including one at their office at 3609 Hwy 24 between Cape Carteret and Morehead City. After the recycled shells are collected and cured, the Coastal Federation works with partners to return them to the water where they provide new habitat for fish and shellfish. 
