Yard Debris

Yard debris is picked up on Mondays and Tuesdays. Please adhere to the guidelines. All yard debris must be out by 7 a.m. the day of collection. Guidelines

- ◆Bring yard debris to the roadway (not in the road, next to the road)
- ◆No plastic bags; paper yard debris bags are accepted
- ◆Containers shall be 35 gallons or less & have a sealable
- ◆Containers must weigh less than 50-lbs when full
- ♦It is prohibited to mix any other items with yard debris
- ♦ Yard debris pickup is provided for residential custom-
- ◆Yard debris in a pile should be less than 5 cubic yards (ie: 4 ft. high, 4 ft. wide & 8 ft. long)
- ◆Permitted yard debris includes: leaves, bush clippings, grass trimmings, trees and branches
- ◆Contractor generated yard debris is not permitted
- ♦ Violations of Town Ordinance Chapter 50 pertaining to Yard Debris can result in a \$150 violation

Voting in Carteret County

- Absentee by mail ballots must be requested with an absentee ballot request form. Ballots are not mailed out to all registered voters.
- There are no drop boxes for ballots. Ballots can be mailed to the Carteret County Board of Elections, 1702 Live Oak Street, Beaufort, NC 28516. Hand-



ed to a precinct official at one-stop (early) voting, or handed to a member of the Carteret County Board of Elections

staff at 1702 Live Oak Street, Beaufort. Individuals returning ballots will be required to sign a log sheet attesting that they are the ones dropping off the ballot.

- Absentee by mail ballots will not be accepted at any Election Day precinct on Election Day. Ballots can only be dropped off at the Board of Elections office or post marked by 5 p.m. on Nov. 3, 2020. Visit https:// www.carteretcountync.gov/434/Board -of-Elections for additional information
- Ballots can only be returned by the voter or a near relative of that voter (spouse, brother, sister, parent, grandparent, child, grandchild, mother-inlaw, father-in-law, son-in-law, daughter-in-law, stepparent, or stepchild).
- There is no identifying party affiliation status on any of the absentee ballot materials.
- In person voting will be offered for one-stop (early) voting and Election Day voting.
- Voters planning to vote in person are encouraged to vote at one-stop (early) voting. Hours & locations: https:// www.carteretcountync.gov/493/One-Stop-Early-Voting

- Voter registration deadline is 5 p.m. Oct. 9, 2020, but voters can still register AND vote at one-stop.
- The last day to submit an absentee ballot request form is 5 p.m. Oct. 27,
- Returned ballot envelopes require the voter's signature and one witness (witness: printed name, full address, and signature).

St. Paul's 2020 Fall Bazaar

The women of St. Paul's Church have a long and storied history of raising money for the Beaufort, Carteret County, and Down East communities through their annual Fall Bazaar. Hurricane Florence caused the cancellation of the Bazaar two years ago, and when the events of the Pandemic cast dark clouds on this year's event, the first ever online St. Paul's Bazaar was born.

St. Paul's Fall Bazaar 2020 is completely virtual. It will go live online at noon on Thursday, Oct. 15 and will continue for two weeks. During that time baked goods, frozen foods, soups, chilis, lasagnas, canned and preserved foods, original art, auction items, gift certificates, raffle tickets, and boxed lunches can be ordered online. Sales and bidding will continue until Nov. 1.

The pickup of ALL purchased items will be at the church at the Ann Street door of the Parish Hall on Saturday, Nov. 14 between 10:30am-1:30pm. Orders will be delivered curbside to each car based on the first letter of the buyer's last name:

The moral of the story is that it's hard to keep good and determined - church ladies down. Recognizing the ongoing needs of the nonprofits and community organizations supported by the Fall Bazaar, the women of St. Paul's are finding new ways to do the important work that has always meant so much to so many. With a hopeful eye toward being able to return to nor-

malcy, the women of St. Paul's are also already planning for an in person Spring Fling at the church on Saturday, March 20, if health conditions allow. This event will include many elements of the annual Bazaar, with some new features added to celebrate the advent of the first day of Spring. In the meantime, everyone is invited to go online on Oct. 15 to participate in this year's Fall Bazaar. The website will be live from 12 p.m. Thursday, Oct.15—9 p.m. on Sunday, Nov. 1. The website

The Carteret County Chamber of Commerce is encouraging everyone to participate in the Taste of the Crystal Coast campaign to support area food and beverage

establishments, including six that are in Beaufort. Those with more than five entries could win gift certificates and other prizes in early November.

"The Taste of the Crystal Coast campaign has more than 30 participating Chamber members across the county, so there is a menu and price point to fit everyone's needs," said Anna Smith, Chamber of Commerce Program Manager.

"While the Chamber is always here to support our members and assist the public, 2020 has brought some unique challenges for everyone. In response, our team has created the Share the Crystal Coast campaign, which will have several phases, and starts with Taste of the Crystal Coast."

The Taste of the Crystal Coast portion began Saturday, Sept. 12, and runs through Saturday, Oct. 31. Flyers are posted to mark participating

There are six locations participating in Beaufort: 34° North Restaurant, Aqua, Clawson's 1905

Restaurant & Pub, Cru Wine Bar & Store, Fishtowne Brew House and Roland's Barbecue. The campaign includes three easy steps: To participate, you must first purchase food or beverage from participating locations. This can include dine-in service, take-out, drive-thru, curbside or delivery, so everyone can select a method that is best for them.

Next, you snap a photo that shows you are dining or drinking with that particular location. This could include a photo of your food, with your food, of your server bringing the order, or other creative ways to show you are a customer. Share the photo to Facebook, Instagram or Twitter with the location tagged, and

#TasteOfTheCrystalCoast and

#ShareTheCrystalCoast. There will be just one entry per purchase, so sharing it across multiple platforms does not count as extra points. Posts must be public in order to be seen and counted. The Chamber's account will "like" or comment on your post to show it has been accepted. For those who do not use social media, entries can be submitted via email to an-

na@nccoastchamber.com. Please write Taste of the Crystal Coast in the subject line, and include the location and hashtags with your photo. The first and last name associated with the submission must also be included.
